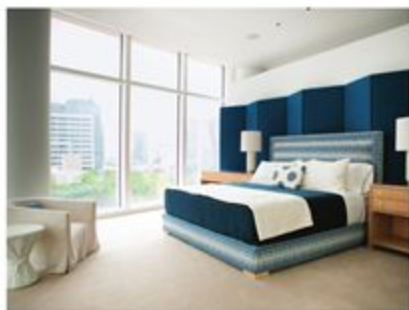


VIEWS FROM THE TOP, TIMES THREE

WHAT ARE DALLAS DESIGNERS DOING INSIDE THE CITY'S MOST BUZZED-ABOUT RESIDENTIAL BUILDING? SEE FOR YOURSELF.

Picture this: You, at home inside the Arts District's newest glass high-rise. (Part of the reasons why are on pages 40 and 41.) Three of the city's top interior designers have made that easier to do by dressing model residences inside the 42-story **MUSEUM TOWER**. The transformers are *Architectural Digest* darling Emily Summers, who filled her airy pied-à-terre with sleek classics such as Knoll's Platner Lounge Chairs; Ann Schooler, who channeled her expertise in the great houses of Britain to bring wood, leather, buttery hues and a few leopard spots to her project; and Marco French, who paired slippery Art Deco furnishings with large-scale contemporary art. Museum Tower is still under construction, but you can schedule a tour of the models now, which range from 2,100 to 3,700 square feet. Instant-gratification type?
